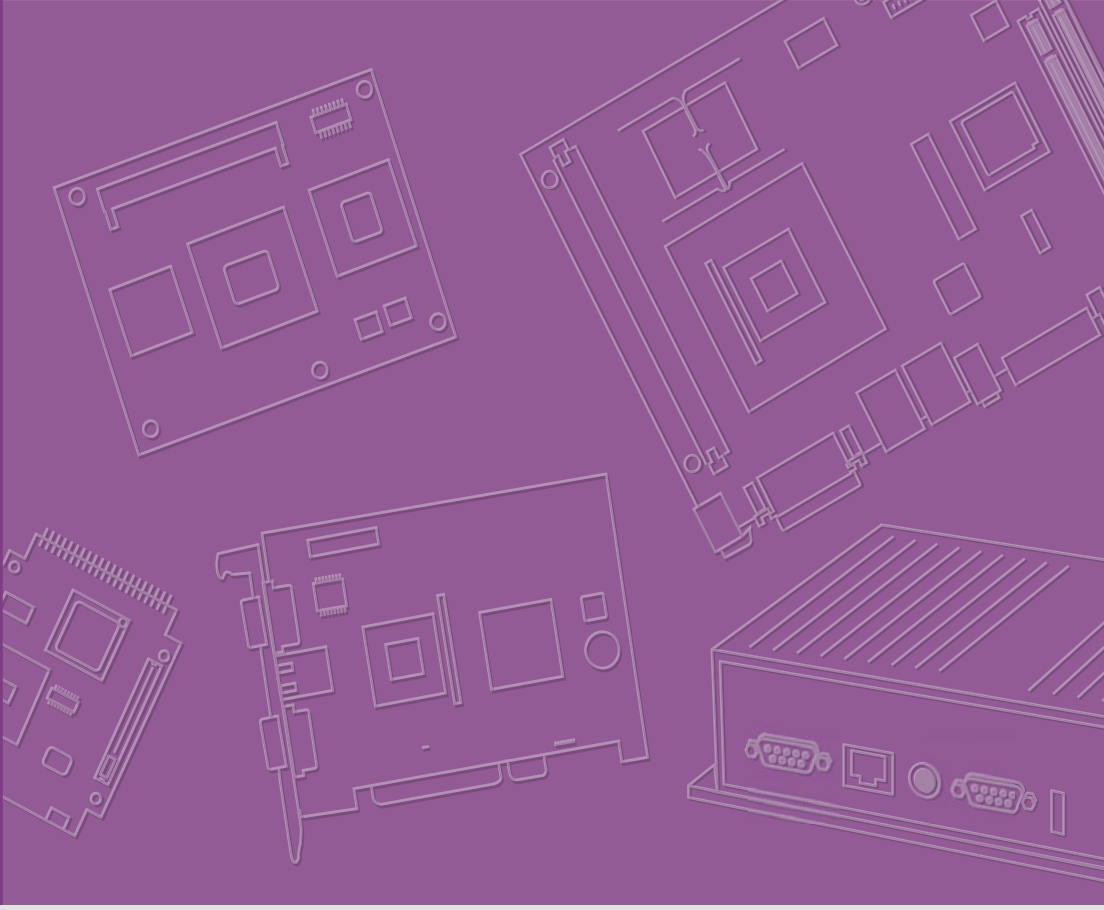

## Declaration of Conformity

## RF Exposure Information (MPE (Maximum Permissible Exposure))

This device meets the government's requirements for exposure to radio waves. This device is designed and manufactured not to exceed the emission limits for exposure to radio frequency (RF) energy set by the Federal Communications Commission of the U.S. Government. The exposure standard for gateway devices employs a unit of measurement known as the Maximum Permissible Exposure or Power Density. The Power Density limit set by the FCC is 1 mW/cm<sup>2</sup>. The MPE evaluation is completed based on all of the radios included and is based on the output power and antenna gain of each.

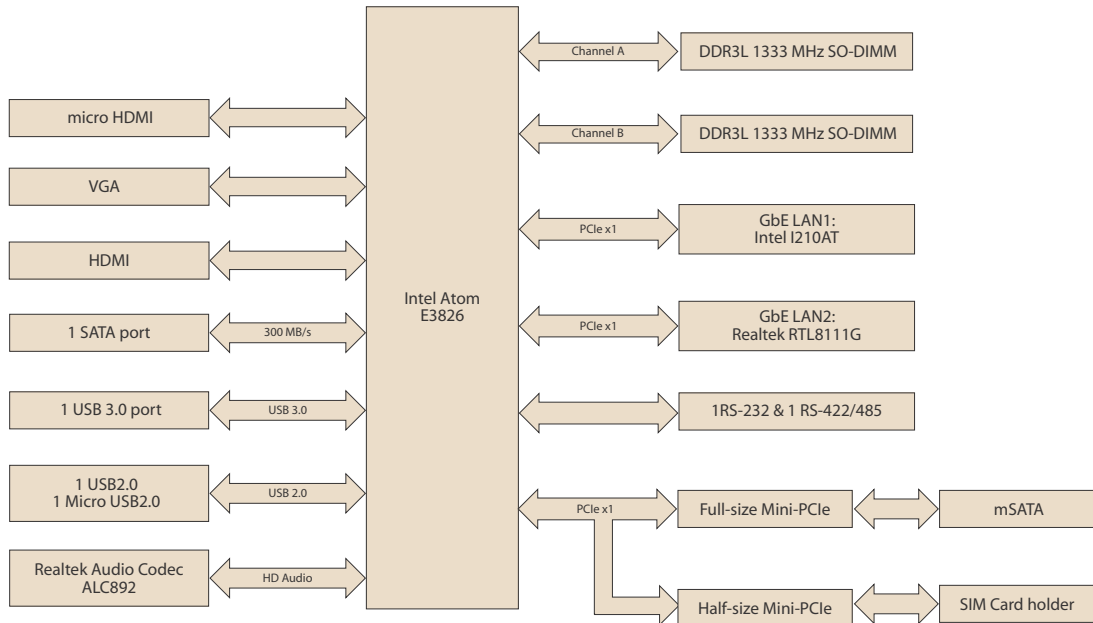

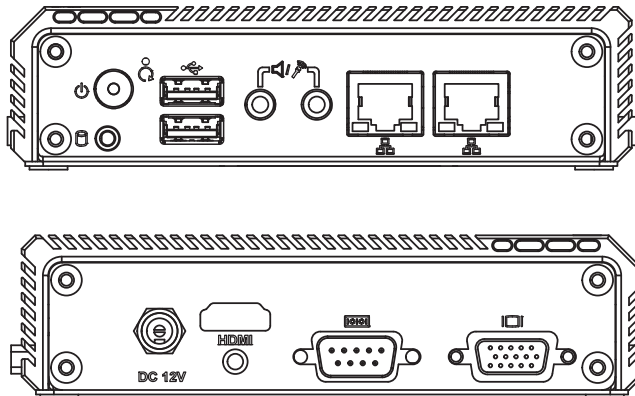

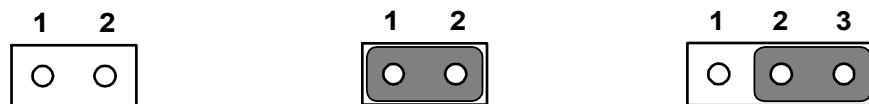
## 2.1 Jumpers

### 2.1.1 Jumper Description

Cards can be configured by setting jumpers. A jumper is a metal bridge used to close an electric circuit. It consists of two metal pins and a small metal clip (often protected by a plastic cover) that slides over the pins to connect them. To close a jumper, you connect the pins with the clip. To open a jumper, you remove the clip. Sometimes a jumper will have three pins, labeled 1, 2 and 3. In this case you would connect either pins 1 and 2, or 2 and 3.



The jumper settings are schematically depicted in this manual as follows.



A pair of needle-nose pliers may be helpful when working with jumpers. If you have any doubts about the best hardware configuration for your application, contact your local distributor or sales representative before you make any changes.

Generally, you simply need a standard cable to make most connections.

**Warning!** To avoid damaging the computer, always turn off the power supply before setting jumpers or clearing CMOS. Before turning on the power supply, make sure CMOS jumper is back to 3.0 V Battery On.



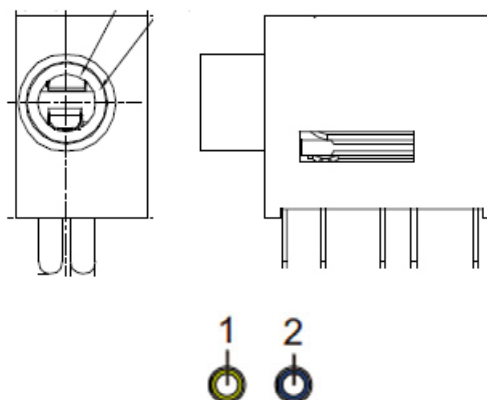

# Chapter 4

BIOS Setup

---

## 4.1 Introduction

AMI BIOS has been integrated into many motherboards for over a decade. With the AMI BIOS Setup program, users can modify BIOS settings and control various system features. This chapter describes the basic navigation of the UTX-3115 BIOS setup screens.

AMI's BIOS ROM has a built-in Setup program that allows users to modify the basic system configuration. This information is stored in flash ROM so it retains the Setup information when the power is turned off.

**Note!** *Default BIOS is supported for 32-bit OS installation, BIOS for 64-bit OS is supported by project, please contact with sales representative for details.*



## 4.2 Entering Setup

### 4.2.1 Main Menu

Press <Del> to enter AMI BIOS CMOS Setup Utility, the Main Menu will appear on the screen. Use arrow keys to select among the items and press <Enter> to accept or enter the sub-menu.



The Main BIOS setup screen has two main frames. The left frame displays all the options that can be configured. Grayed-out options cannot be configured; options in blue can. The right frame displays the key legend.

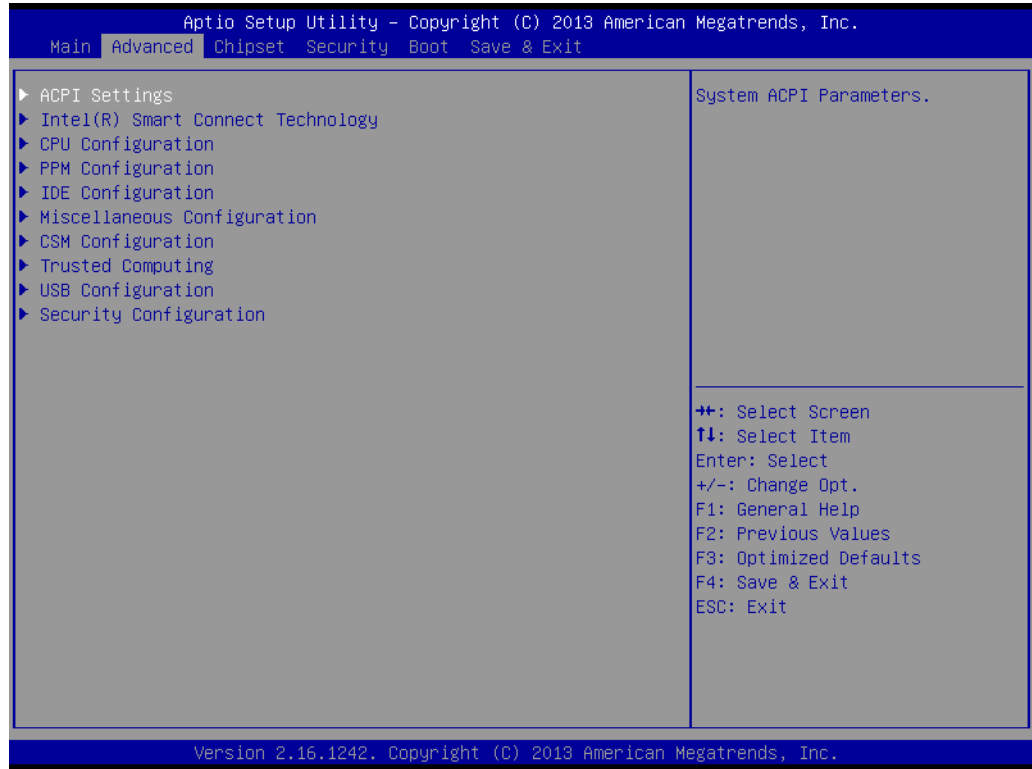
Above the key legend is an area reserved for a text message. When an option is selected in the left frame, it is highlighted in white. Often a text message will accompany it.

#### ■ System time / System date

Use this option to change the system time and date. Highlight System Time or System Date using the <Arrow> keys. Enter new values through the keyboard. Press the <Tab> key or the <Arrow> keys to move between fields. The date must be entered in MM/DD/YY format. The time must be entered in HH:MM:SS format.

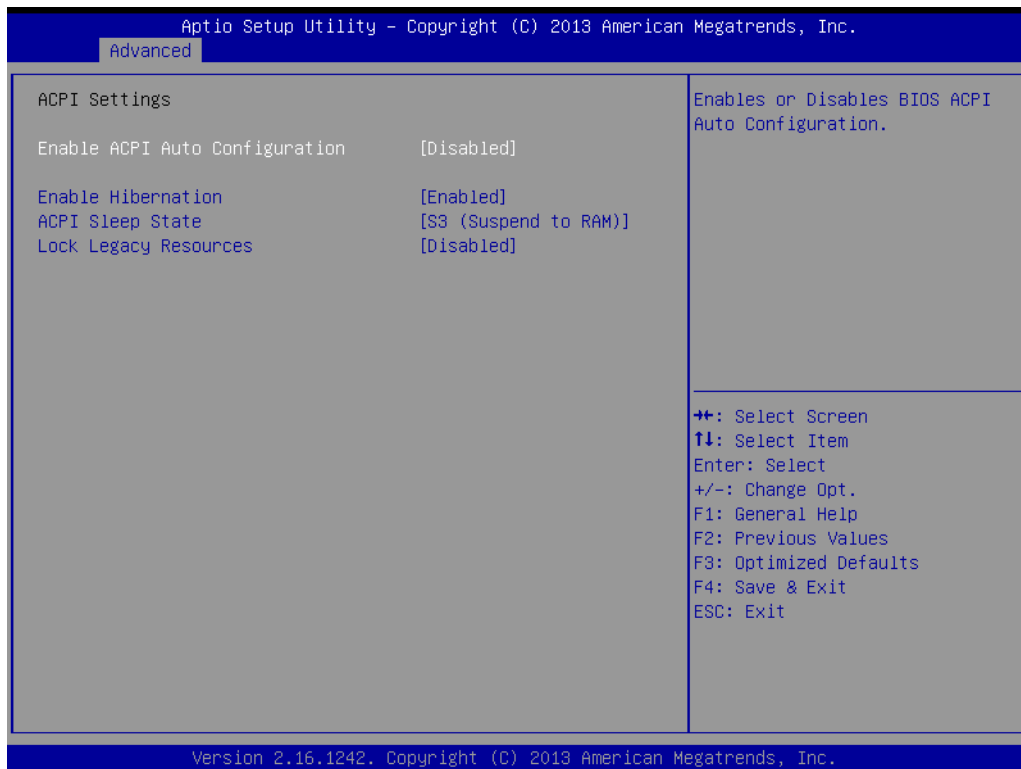
## 4.2.2 Advanced BIOS Features
